- Write a 300-500-word essay on the topic, "How would attending college impact your life and community?"

The scholarship committee began its first effort to raise funds for the scholarship April 27 with a fundraising event at Uno Pizzeria at the Inner Harbor. The event turned out to be quite successful.

The next fundraising event is scheduled for May 25 at Pizza Hut in Catonsville. We are looking to surpass the success of the first event and invite all sorors to bring their families and friends. As with the Uno event, THZ will receive 20 percent of each sale as long as the customer presents a THZ flyer.
