Oldest soror celebrates 105 years of life

Soror Carlotta Stewart Watson celebrated 105 years on Monday, Oct 10.

She was born Oct.10, 1900, the granddaughter of a slave. Soror Watson taught in Memphis schools for 54 years and was the first certified and qualified school counselor in the district. She also served as "Aunt Carrie" on WDIA, linking community members with resources for assistance.

Soror Watson is the only remaining charter member of Alpha Eta Zeta Chapter, which was chartered in 1939. She was the first Basileus of the chapter and guided the members as they used their leadership skills and talents to implement the sorority's ideals of Finer Womanhood, Scholarship, Service and Sisterly Love.

Soror Watson was instrumental in the chartering of Pi Alpha Chapter at LeMoyne-Owen College, and much later Rho Gamma Chapter at Memphis State University. She is still financially active at 104 years of age.
