THZ shows Heart for Homeless

Members of Tau Eta Zeta gathered at the War Memorial Plaza in Downtown Baltimore Sunday, January 29 for the Heart for the Homeless clothing drive.

The event was a resounding success, with more than 20 large bags of warm clothing donated to the homeless.

"I think this event was a great example of how even a chapter with small numbers can affect a large community," said Soror Katrina Debnam, chairperson of the Community Ser-

vice committee. "We solicited garments from our fathers, uncles, cousins, husbands, and co-workers to make this winter season a little more bearable for the homeless men, women, and children of Baltimore City. Words can not express the gratitude that was shown to us during this event."

In all, approximately 50 people, men and women, walked away with coats, sweaters, pants, T-shirts, and other garments. Remaining clothing was donated to the Karis Home and the Baltimore Rescue Mission.

This Boule, hosted by the Southeastern Region, promises to be one of excitement, camaraderie and enjoyment as we come together in Hollywood, Fla. to convene the Boule of the Blazing Sun and the Burning Sands.

Early conference registration ends April 1, but sorors are encouraged to begin booking their rooms at the Westin as early as Friday, February 17. Hotel rates start at \$159 per night for single and double occupancy. To get
